
From The Rector

Team effort to be proud of...

"Church and community working together..."

John and Alfred Flack were born in Loughton, Essex on 11th July 1907. Both have lived in various places in the world and were inseparable until Alfred, who lives in Devon, worked abroad as a missionary and John's work took him to Kidderminster, Worcestershire.



Message from Her Majesty

They received very special letter from the Queen that said: "I am so pleased to know that you and your brother are celebrating vour hundredth one birthdays. I send my congratulations and best wishes to on such a unique occasion."

The brothers said they "never dreamt" of both reaching 100 years old but said the bond between them has grown even tighter as the years progressed.

"We can appreciate the privilege of living for so long," said Alfred. He added, "we put it down to our faith and not to any other miracle".

John's daughter, Heather Flack, said she has got her father and uncle mixed up in the past. "They still look quite alike and they still have a lot of similar mannerisms and the voices occasionally have confused me."

PRODH



PROJECT FOR THE RENEWAL OF DRUIDS HEATH

PRODH (Project for the Renewal of Druids Heath) developed from an initiative by Kings Norton Parish. The area of Druids Heath comes within the boundaries of the Parish and there used to be a Worshipping Community who met on the estate. However, this had to close due to a lack of resources in 2005. Not wishing to abandon the people who make up a large percentage of the Parish population, One of the team Vicars was sent to discover how the needs of residents could best be met.

After a time of research and profiling, Reverend David Gould came to the conclusion that the estate had two major needs: the first requirement was for cohesion, many statutory authorities and voluntary groups provide support to those who live on the estate but few people seemed to know about the range of services that they could access; the second need was for something that could provide a bridge to those service-providers.

Funding was applied for and gained from the Church Urban Fund and 'Together We Can': a division of 'Communities and Local Government' This enabled PRODH to employ a Community Development Officer to make relationships with people on the estate, understand their issues, needs and aspirations and develop a Community Council that truly represents the residents, allows them access to services, gives them a voice to express any concerns or ideas and is consulted by the statutory authorities in all matters of import that concern the area.

Karen Urwin was appointed by PRODH in May 2007. She has had extensive community experience on Druids Heath estate, beginning with helping out at Summer Play Schemes in the late '70s and

moving on to becoming Secretary of the Bells Farm Community Association. She is currently the chairman of the Lane Theatre group, who perform community theatre events from Manningford Hall, and has run a Cub Scout Pack on the estate for over 16 years. Karen is also a present member of the Manningford Hall Management Group and Bells Farm Community Association.

Karen has links with Kings Norton Parish also, having always worshipped at St. Nicolas Church and being an active member of the econgregation.

She said, "Obviously there is a lot to do but the relationships that

PRODH is building and the way the community is so welcoming is very heartening". She continued, "I find the openness with which the residents discuss issues and the partnerships that are beginning to develop most exciting. I have a true sense that this project has a future in improving the lives of all those who live on Druids".



Restoration Update

"Progress on site continues We are now busy with planning for the re-opening of the Old Grammar School in late autumn and the main building next spring..."

Progress on site continues - despite the rain. The new roof is almost complete on the North and East ranges of the main Tudor building and looks very impressive. We are just finishing the repair of the chimneys. The basement walls have been formed and work is underway on interior block work. Next will come the steelwork for the new wing. Do keep looking.

At the Old Grammar School work continues on stone repairs and on replacing the rotten timber frame on the first floor above the doorway, now almost complete. Investigation all but confirms the theory that the older upper floor was brought from elsewhere and placed on the newer ground floor.



Investigation work on the fireplaces in the parlour and the Queen's Room has also revealed two medieval fireplaces including one complete with medieval painted beams.

We have also hosted visits to the site by the West Midlands Heritage Architects, Councillor Lines - Cabinet member for Housing for Birmingham City Council, by Ecclesiastical Insurance and the Head of Corporate Affairs from M&B Breweries. All were very encouraged and inspired by our buildings and the progress of the Project.

We are now busy with planning for the reopening of the Old Grammar School in late autumn and the main building next spring. Watch this space!

Mandate to Difference:

An Invitation to the Contemporary Church Author Walter Brueggemann

Published by WJK £12.99 ISBN: ISBN: 0 664 231121 7

The author, Walter Brueggemann, is now Professor Emeritus of Old Testament in the William Marcellus McPheeters Chair Columbia Theological Seminary. Decatur. Georgia. If you did not know better I suspect many of us would stop at that point, put down the book and certainly not take this review any further! BUT! Stop, what if here was a highly regarded writer writing in a way that was exciting, accessible, interesting, like the beach novel you have just read (or 10 if like me on holiday!), a book that you wanted to keep reading, not put down.

May I dare to suggest that this is one of those books? No, it's not a comic or Hello magazine, but it is readable. I put it off for three months having bought it thinking here was a book I should read!

In this book the church is called to stand out clearly and courageously to defy political polarisation, consumerism and militarism, not to give in to the temptation to live in a cocoon of safety but to live and be in such a way that fear and anxiety is despatched and adversaries become friends. That's just the back cover!

I am now half way through the fourth chapter and having dipped into the rest can commend this book with confidence. Chapter One: The Good News of Regime Change is a call to se all under the management of God and that the call is to align ones life, ones vocation for all life, more fully with God and not allow ourselves to think that Christianity is just a set of rules and pseudo moral certainty. Chapter Two develops

a theology of city in all its Weeping and Hoping and the call not to lose heart. Chapter Three is a call to hear the Sabbath Voice of God in Jesus and enables us to speak and live and be against death and denial and despair. It speaks of how those who sought to destroy Jesus did so because the practice of Sabbath of rest and of hope in more than the material, subverts the entire world of acquisitiveness and therefore threatened their whole world because that was needed to keep the wheels of commerce going! By the time you read this I will have finished the book and I am looking forward to the rest of it! For all those who believe that as faith communities we have a positive message of hope to offer in the model of offering that Jesus modelled for us then do buy a copy of this book and rejoice for the clarity and wisdom of authors such as this!



The Met Office have their own site at www.metoffice.org where they supply detailed five day forecasts with information for every 3 hours during the day. You can search for regional information or more specifically by post code depending on how much detail you want.

If you are going abroad for your holiday you can check out www.worldweather.org the website of the World Meteorological Organization. This site has information on over 150 countries and forecasts for most popular holiday destinations

The BBC website is another mine of information. At www.bbc.co.uk/weather you can not only get UK and World forecasts, but also information on climate change, what you can do about it and generally understanding the causes of the different types of weather. There is also a photo gallery which is well worth a look and it even tells you how to build your own weather station so you can do some forecasting of your own.



I think a fine course which I trust will show fruit in the ministry I am called to over years to come.


