Sunday 28th January 2024— Presentation, Candlemas

When the time was right, Mary and Joseph carried out the traditional Jewish ceremonies following the birth of a child: circumcision, redemption of the newborn, and purification of the mother. On taking baby Jesus to the temple to be consecrated by God, his parents had encounters with two people - Simeon and Anna. Simeon and Anna may have both been old but they were faithful, prayerful, and hopeful individuals. As such they were able to recognise Jesus for who he was - not just another baby, but the Messiah.

Simeon and Anna both spoke about the child Jesus to his parents and I expect Mary and Joseph pondered on what they were told, especially Mary. No new mother wants to be told that a sword will pierce their soul. As older people in Jewish society Simeon and Anna would have been respected, and their opinions and wisdom valued. I wonder how much we respect and value the wisdom of our elders today? Do we listen to what they have to say? Maybe if we take the time to hear our elders we can learn and grow and be able to recognise the Messiah for ourselves.
