'So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.' Mark 16:8

'He/She's gone' is a phrase sometimes used at the moment a person dies. Jesus had 'gone'. The women had seen it. They'd been there as he breathed his last breath. But now they had come to his tomb, to perform an everyday rite following death, and Jesus had, quite literally, GONE. It was a true 'What? How? Hand over mouth' moment. Mark says, with amazing understatement, that they were 'amazed'. But he also says that they were terrified. Jesus, the most precious thing in their life, had gone. Even the angel's assurance that He had risen and gone ahead to Galilee, could not console them. Is it any wonder? In their amazement and terror, how could they be expected to remember what Jesus had said, even if they really understood what He meant by his words? So they fled and, in their terror, told no-one.

But we know that what they had seen and heard did get told, again and again; and those who heard it were just as amazed. As they heard, and as they told in their turn, they understood what Jesus meant: Death could not hold Him.

He lives and so will we:

Jesus lives! thy terrors now can no more, O death, appal us: Jesus lives! by this we know thou, O grave, canst not enthral us. Alleluia.
