



From The Rector God's continual promise is to be with us...

"Do we need anything more than the Cross of Jesus to tell us this?"

Lent, Love your Neighbour, Restoration and so much else – it doesn't get any quieter.

We wish for peace, but there always seems to be something to challenge or disturb it. No wonder Jesus said "Peace is my parting gift to you – but not as the world gives it." Within all the opportunities the world gives for new friendship, trust, confidence and brave risk, there so often seems to lurk the unforeseen and unexpected. People disappoint. New ventures run into the sand. Hopes take so much longer to fulfil than we want. We focus on our own needy weakness rather than God's strength and promise.

It matters. God's continual promise is to be with us and to seek our trust in all that happens. One of the easiest triumphs of evil is when it draws us away from that trust. We are drawn in and so quickly overcome by problems, large or small, petty or lifechanging — and so forget that God gives strength in *all* things.

Do we need anything more than the Cross of Jesus to tell us this? In Jesus' death and rising, we know that God's love is deeper, stronger and wider than sin, suffering and death, ours and others. The huge trust of Psalm 23; the depth of God's love of our neighbour and ourselves in Jesus' Summary of the Law; the fullness of Jesus' teaching that we pray "Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven"; all these and so much more point us to the hope that is for us and for all through the Cross and resurrection of Jesus. Ours and others' failings are not the last word. That is spoken by Jesus on the Cross: "It is finished", not as

desperate failure but as God's work of love completed, fulfilled.


This Lent, we are following the Diocesan course "Love your neighbour." As we use it, I pray that we will be taken out of our personal concerns. We may even meet more neighbours, fresh or familiar, whom God has We will be challenged - not in ourselves alone, but in the trust we place in God's peace and promise when all around is strange or hard to bear. I pray also that our use of the texts of Stages on the Way (Jesus' Summary of the Law, the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles Creed and the Beatitudes) will strengthen our faith and trust in God's purpose and presence for all, no matter where we are or who we are with. That never fails. We do when we forget it.

Please pray for new ventures on Druids Heath and through each of the three Team churches. Please pray for Restoration as work at last begins. Please pray for Heather as she retires and for us all as we prepare for moving on. Please pray above all that our hearts and minds are more and more fixed on God's faithfulness, so that we may share it in all things, for the sake of the Gospel, of our neighbours – and of ourselves.

This Lent may you grow in the peace of Christ, not as the world gives, but as He does through the giving of the Holy Spirit. His is a peace "which passes all understanding" – a gift wholly undeserved – but freely and lovingly given. Please trust that it is for you.

A NEW ELECTORAL ROLL!

"it really does matter to the church in Kings Norton – and we hope to you."

Your pulse may not be racing at this news – but it really does matter to the church in Kings Norton – and we hope to you.

The Electoral Roll is the nearest that the Church of England has to a membership list. We're not a club or a closed society. We are open - for all who live in the parish and for all who live outside but want to share fully in our life and worship.

If you live in the parish or worship regularly here, as long as you are baptized and aged 16 or over, you can join the Electoral Roll simply by filling in a form. Forms will be available in all three Team churches and from the Parish Office

Why join? Because it shows a commitment to the work of God's church here. In a healthy church, there is a strong and growing Electoral Roll.

Electoral Roll members are also able to vote for Church Council members and to be married in St Nicolas. But it is the sympathy and support for the Church's work that matters most. Part of the assessment of the Common Fund (the sum we pay to the diocese towards clergy and other central church costs) is based on the number of people on the Electoral Roll.

Why a new Electoral Roll?

Every six years, the Electoral Roll is completely renewed. The old one is scrapped and a completely new one made.

Everyone who wants to be on it has to complete a new form. In December we were told that this six-yearly scrapping and re-making of parish Electoral Rolls due in 2008 is to be brought forward to 2007 and it must be completed two weeks before our Annual Parochial Church Meeting. To give us time for proper renewal, the APCM has been moved from 29th March to Monday 23rd April at 7pm in St Nicolas

What else?

Church

In the past, the Renewal of the Electoral Roll has given us a very valuable opportunity to renew the whole parish membership list and also to approach everyone about Christian Giving and encourage renewal of affiliation to the church's life and work.

We did this very usefully in 2002 – and now we want to do it again. .

During Lent, we want to ensure that all present and potential ER members have been invited to complete ER forms - and also to review their Christian Giving. Many will also want to have the basics of church finance and Christian Giving explained to them.

Can you help? Will you think about responding - encourage others. It does matter!

"Pledge it" is an opportunity to join with others in organising fund raising events for Christian Aid.


Anyone and everyone can join in.

CHURCHYARD MAINTENANCE

'the snowdrops and crocuses have been in flower around the Churchyard and the daffodils are waiting their turn to delight and welcome us to spring'

As you will have noticed the snowdrops and crocuses have been in flower around the Churchyard and the daffodils are waiting their turn to delight and welcome us to spring. These flowers, the trees and grass all need care and attention and this work has been carried out by volunteers. As we all appreciate volunteers are not immortal and each year we need a regular influx of new volunteers if we are to keep up the maintenance of the Churchyard. Are you able to help us out?

There are basically two volunteer groups which carry out care and maintenance work in the Churchyard and their current tasks are outlined below:

Wednesday Evenings

There is a Wednesday evening mixed group (Churchyard Caring Team) which meets on alternate Wednesday evenings between April and September from 7.00 pm to about 8.30 pm with refreshments provided at half time. If the weather is very wet we will meet on the next evening (Thurs). This group carries out light work including grass cutting and tidying around the cremation plots to the right hand side of Mirey Lane and adjacent to the northern boundary of the Rectory garden.

The dates for 2007 are:-

April 18th - May 2nd, 16th and 30th June 13th and 27th - July 11th and 25th Aug 8th and 22nd - Sept 5th

Thursday Mornings

The Thursday morning group meets most Thursday mornings between 9.30 am and 12 noon (except for a period of 4 to 6 weeks around Christmas time). The work carried out is medium to heavy work and includes trimming bushes, tidying neglected graves, removal of self-set trees, brambles, ivy etc., filling and seeding sunken graves and any other minor tasks that arise during the season.

Both groups require further volunteers to replace those who have moved from the area etc. if the maintenance of the Churchyard is to be kept up to standard. The Churchyard is a good advertisement for the Church and in addition has a considerable effect on the choice of venue for couples wishing to get married.

if you are interested or know someone who may be keen in joining either group even on an occasional basis or would like further information please contact Ian Manson (459 3165), Richard Harper (458 1549) or the Church Office (458 3289, open 10-1, weekdays). Volunteers who are not regular worshippers will also be made most welcome and you will be allowed time off to take your holidays and days off!

BOOK REVIEW

Power and Passion: Six Characters in Search of Resurrection

Samuel Wells Published by Zondervan £8.99

ISBN 0-310-27017-0

This book is the Archbishop of Canterbury's Official 2007 Lent Book and with that on a sticker staring up from the cover you may well dismiss it if you tried his recommendation last year...

However you would miss not only a good book but one from who Dr Williams calls an "outstanding thinker and an outstanding pastor". Dr Williams also says that he found in this volume "an encounter with the crucified and risen. Jesus"

So, does the book live up to the Archbishop's words? I picked it up and flipped through it and noticed first of all the very straight forward language, language that nonetheless succeeded in handling some hard thoughts. I liked the way that a series of characters was treated to a thorough examination, comparisons made across the gospels and explorations were made into background that let one enter into the stories of the peoples' lives.

I bought the book and guite soon into it realised that the Archbishop was right, that here was a person used to dealing with people in a parish and not shying away from hard thinking. Samuel Wells looks at the whole issue of how passion and politics relate, about what happens if our



understanding politics has no place for resurrection and then the big question, are God's passion: is he ours?

The characters examined are Pontius Pilate: Barabbas: Joseph of Arimathea: Mrs Pilate...yes that is

not a misprint; Peter and Mary Magdalene. After each is a series of questions and a prayer which invite us to allow time for thoughtful reflection and the recognition that, speaking for myself, I learnt something new about each person as I turned the pages of this fascinating book.

You will receive this magazine a little after the start of lent. Do not let that deter you from adding this book to your next shopping list! It may well have the effect of changing how you approach lent this year, adding to the richness of all you have brought to your Lenten journey over the years.

A NOSTALGIC RETURN

Patricia's mom lived at 33 The Green, which sadly is no longer here. Patricia told me, "My parents where married at St Nicolas Church, had their wedding reception at the 'Saracen's' and are buried here in the churchyard., so Kings Norton is very special in our memories and in our hearts."

She added, "As Des and I are now living in Little Witley, Worcestershire, we only get here occasionally but thankfully my lovely sister, Anne (Turner), who lives in Northfield, is a very regular visitor to the family grave.

Des remembered with affection his youth and the happy times he'd had with friends during their evenings at the 'Boxing Club' which was held at the Saracen's Head

As he looked nostalgically at sheltered flats for the elderly Des recalled, "That's where the Kings Norton Picture House once stood." With an air of pride he said, "I was at the opening of that cinema in the 1930's. It was officially opened by Gracie Fields who was to become famous during the war with songs like 'Sally... Pride of our Alley." (The King's Norton Cinema opened in September 1938. The architect was Harold Seymour Scott and it seated 1,142. It closed in June 1983.)

Patricia and Des were so obviously 'moved' by their visit to 'old pastures' but continued to share their precious moments that can never be recaptured, but will never be forgotten.

With a final melancholy look at the buildings, the Green and the place that was once home, Patricia and Des said, "Kings Norton always was... and always will be a very special place to us."

The Church at Druids Heath

For many months a growing team of people have been looking at two strands of work for renewing the ministry of the church on Druids Heath. Broadly this falls under two heading: Community Regeneration and Church Services of some sort. I only chair PRODH< Project for the Renewal of Druids Heath; its effectiveness as a team derives from the commitment of some from the wider parish, deanery and diocese and some from the community of Druids Heath.

These people have given generously of their time and creative thinking. The net result as of today, 11th February 2007 is that we are about to recruit somebody to work on the community regeneration task under the auspices of The Nehemiah Project, an initiative under the Forum for Community Regeneration of The Diocese of Birmingham. This post will be part funded by a Civic Renewal Grant from London which encourages experimental attempts top rejuvenate local communities and their civic aspirations. Birmingham City Council is also a major partner.

This piece of work will provide the profile for the renewal of Church life under the auspices of The Parish of Kings Norton, working in partnership with many other agencies on Druids Heath and I have been grateful for their welcome into the community life and its networks.

We had hoped to share use of The Phoenix but are now looking to work out of Manningford Hall on Bells Lane, working with its committee and other users. We have begun to build contact with two other churches in the area and look for ways of real co-operation in ministry in the area.

The first evidence of church services was the Christingle held last Christmas and the forthcoming Pancake Party on Shrove Tuesday. We are beginning to look at the possibility of a service at Easter and the development of services on a regular basis after that. In all this I am delighted that much of the initiative comes from those living and working on Druids Heath and that we as Church can serve that initiative in what is hopefully a sensitive and supportive way.

Do pray that this work will go forward with care and courage and that the many things currently going on in the area the church can play its part in making very best uses of the resources at our disposal.

My thanks to all who have supported and prayed to date. Do feel able to call or email me if you would like to ask questions or make suggestions, they will be warmly welcomed!

Jessica and Terri found they had lots in common and Jessica had soon introduced Terri to all her other friends as well. She went on to the 'web' on her computer and found out all about Oxfam and then held a coffee morning with her mum's help for her family and friends to raise money for them.

Sometimes it was hard work but Jessica found that she really enjoyed everything she did. She enjoyed seeing people's faces when she did something special for them. She enjoyed seeing how her new friend, Terri became happier and more confident. She enjoyed sharing and learning from all the different people she talked to. About halfway through Lent Jessica's teacher was teaching them about Easter and how

people try to get ready for it. She asked if anyone was doing anything for Lent. Sarah put her hand up first. "Yes Sarah, what are you doing?" asked their teacher. "I've given up chocolate for Lent, Miss." said Sarah.

"That's right Sarah, you keep complaining about how hard it is." replied her teacher. "It is hard, Miss but I haven't eaten any." Sarah stated proudly.

"Why have you given up chocolate Sarah?" asked the teacher.

"Errr, 'cause that's what you do for Lent, Miss, you give things up."

"I'm not quite sure that, that is what Lent is about, Sarah, I think it is about thinking of others. What have you been doing Jessica? Miss Miles asked.

"I've been doing my Love Life, Live Lent book, Miss." replied Jessica hesitantly. "I've kept a diary too. "

Miss Miles smiled, "Could you read out some of your entries, Jessica.

Slowly Jessica read out some of the things she had done. Miss Miles encouraged the children to discuss what they had heard. All of the children agreed that the Love Life, Live Lent books were a great idea and a number of them said that they would try to do some of the activities over the remaining weeks. Both girls had found the real meaning of Lent and when it came to Easter they enjoyed eating all their Easter eggs but neither of them forgot that it was really about celebrating Jesus and how He gave up everything for us.



Sarah Hitchin's Story

Where I work, there are hundreds of people. We receive hundreds of e-mails every day, many of them junk. An extended and detailed version of the e-mail below was forwarded to our entire region. This is how the e-mail began...there isn't room to repeat it all:

PLEASE READ AND PLEASE HELP. I NEED A BONE MARROW DONOR!

Hi, my name is Sarah and I was diagnosed with ALL (Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia) on December 22nd, 2004. I was in remission by September 2005, but unfortunately it resurfaced in July 2006. At the moment I am in need of a bone marrow transplant and am unable to find a match as I have a rare tissue type. The only hope for me now is that someone like you comes forward and proves to be a match for my tissue type. Quite simply, it's a life or death situation.

Sarah goes on to describe ways in which people can offer their blood for analysis when donating and gives details and contacts. Many of the people in our office have been deeply affected by their friend's sudden illness. She moved many miles away, left the office, her job, her home, her family to be near a specialist unit. Her office friends kept in touch, feeling helpless, missing her lively personality and energy. She finishes as follows:

I would like to express a HUGE thanks for your time in helping. If you have any further questions, please email me on

Please feel free to pass this email on to anyone you can think of. We really need as many people as possible to join the register. You are our only hope.

Thank-you Sarah

I read this e-mail on Wednesday but by Friday there was a full-scale operation to recruit enough blood donor volunteers to justify employing an Anthony Nolan nurse to visit the office and take blood on the premises. A friend of mine is close to Sarah, and said that though he hated pain, and didn't know if his bone marrow would be a match, that he would definitely have the operation if it would give her a better quality of life. My friend professes no religious belief at all, he just loves his friend.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends' John 15 v. 13 (NRSV New Testament p175)

Fresh Expressions of church are new and different ways of being church in a changing culture. Fresh expressions of church begin where people are and make church and community there. The Fresh Expression initiative has come out of the concern of Dr Rowan Williams, Archbishop of Canterbury, to encourage new ways of being church in a changing culture in the United Kingdom. The following is taken from the Fresh Expressions website:

Changes in church and society

Our society is changing all the time. Overall, Church attendance has gone down for many years but in many places you will also find growing congregations.

There are different ways to describe the changes. Here are some of them.

From the centre to the edge

Church has moved from a central role in our society to the edges. At the same time, the "centre" of our society is moving around. As churches, we need to learn to live at the edge again – to rebuild community there.

From geography to network

For hundreds of years, people in Britain have related to one another primarily because of where they live: in the same town or village. People from the same place would go to school together, grow up together and often work together.

For all that time, the church also related to people because of where they lived. The whole of England is divided into parishes. Each one has a church and most have a vicar.

Over the last fifty years, society itself has changed. People move around more. They work in different places. Most of us live in cities not villages. People get to know one another now through networks of friendship, through work colleagues, through sharing the same interests.

It is no longer enough for the church simply to relate to people because of where they live (although we still need the parish system). The churches need to serve the whole of society. That means relating to networks as well as to areas.



On Saturday May 12th The Parish of Kings Norton is hosting a National Vision and Training Day for Birmingham for Fresh Expressions at Hawkesley School from 9.30 to 4.00pm. In this we are building on the work being done at Druids Heath to develop a new way of relating to the community of Druids Heath. We will be joined for the day by the Dean of Birmingham Cathedral and the Chair of the Birmingham Methodist District together with members of the Fresh Expressions team. There will be special seminars to encourage our thinking including ones led by people from this parish with thoughts from our experience as well as from friends across Birmingham.

We do hope you will want to be part of this day and may even consider playing a part in the planning for and operation of the day. Please watch for further details or call/email me. I look forward to hearing from you.


