The Women's World Day of Prayer is an international and interdenominational movement. Starting from seeds of local prayer initiatives in early 19th Century USA, it first became a specific event in 1922 when two sedarate united days of prayer, in USA and Canada respectively, came together - on the first Friday of Lent. Very soon it spread beyond the Northern American continent, and the First Friday of March became the day when women all over the world are called to join each other in prayer and support. The service each year is prepared by women of a specific country or island range – this year we are lead by the ladies of Cameroon and all of our songs reflect the lively worship of that country. There is one hymn that is always a part of each service though, as it SO points to prayer and praise being a perpetual and continuous thread around the world: I quote two verses from "The day thou gavest, Lord, is ended"

As o'er each continent and island the dawn leads on another day, the voice of prayer is never silent nor dies the strain of praise away.

The sun that bids us rest is waking our sisters 'neath the western sky, and hour by hour fresh lips are making thy wondrous doings heard on high.

The other central part of the printed service is, of course, the Lord's Prayer – said in thousands of languages and linking us with Christians all around the globe. This year we have been given a meditation on the Lord's Prayer by Margie Savage.

I cannot pray OUR, if my faith has no room for others and their need.

I cannot pray FATHER, if I do not demonstrate this relationship to God in my daily living. I cannot pray WHO ART IN HEAVEN, if all my interests and pursuits are on earthly things. I cannot pray HALLOWED BE THY NAME, if I am not striving, with God's help, to be holy. I cannot pray THY KINGDOM COME, if I am unwilling or resentful of having it in my life. I cannot pray ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN, unless I am truly ready to give myself to God's service here and now.

I cannot pray GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD, without expending honest effort for it, or if I would withhold from my neighbour the bread that I receive.

I cannot pray LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION, if I deliberately choose to remain in a situation where I am likely to be tempted.

I cannot pray DELIVER US FROM EVIL, if I am not prepared to fight evil with my life and my prayer.

I cannot pray THINE IS THE KINGDOM, if I am unwilling to obey the King. I cannot pray, THINE IS THE POWER AND THE GLORY, if I am seeking power for myself and my own glory first.

I cannot pray FOR EVER AND EVER, if I am too anxious about each day's affairs. I cannot pray AMEN, unless I honestly say ,"Cost what it may, this is my prayer."

ent is about getting ready for Easter. It's what the church has done for ■ hundreds of years. In 2010 we'll do it again. But, if it is to mean anything more than six weeks of weight-watching and extra church, we need to ask "And then?"

Every story about lesus seems to come to us first as a story with a lesson, complete in itself. But life isn't like that - and neither are the more and more confident in our stories of lesus. They lead on and grow from one to the next. They are full of "And then?" In Lent, Holy Week and Easter we need to give real attention to their special stories, traditions and services. But they lead on, like every life-changing story, to something more.

And when we tell and live the story of Jesus now, we can't escape the "And then?" of every moment.

What might this be?

Nothing less than lives renewed by unfolds after Easter. God's "And God's grace in confident faith, hope and love, for this life - and the next. This isn't something woolly and escapist. It is what in God's love will make real

touchable difference to all who share in it – and to the communities of Kings Norton in which we live, work, pray, suffer and rejoice.

My hope for Lent, Holy Week and Easter in 2010 is that many more will be able to enter as fully as you can into this astounding story, in services, gatherings and our own times of quiet each day (however short!) As we do, we shall become answers to God's question, "And then?"



CHURCHYARD MAINTENANCE

Itogether we have some seven acres of Churchyard to maintain at St Nicolas. Although we have paid a team who cut the grass on a regular basis during the spring and summer, it is the other work outside their remit around the Churchyard which is carried out by volunteers. Very many thanks to all the various volunteers for their help in 2009.



We urgently need <u>some new volunteers</u> for 2010 to keep our numbers up so that we can keep up a high standard of maintenance in the Churchyard. The condition of the Churchyard is an advertisement for and an invitation to St Nicolas Church and also has a considerable effect on the choice of venue for couples wishing to get married. Furthermore, we have many visitors to the Old Grammar School and St Nicolas Place and we need to ensure that the Churchyard is in tiptop condition throughout the year.

There are basically two volunteer groups which carry out care and maintenance work in the Churchyard and their current tasks are listed below:

Wednesday Evenings

There is a Wednesday evening mixed group (Churchyard Caring Team) which meets on alternate Wednesday evenings between April and September from 7pm to about 8/8.30pm with refreshments at half time. If the weather is wet, we will normally meet on the next evening (Thursday). This group carries out light work including grass

The Lent Sunday readings in church make us ask "And then?"

Every Sunday in Lent, the main reading from the Gospel stories of Jesus is lovely in itself. But it is only when we ask "And then?" that they can grow into the heart of our lives.

On the First Sunday of Lent, we meet Jesus as he is tested in the wilderness (Luke 4.1-13). He has just been baptised in the River Jordan at the very start of his public ministry. He is tested, as we are, but not to give a master class in resisting temptation. It is to prepare for all that is to come. And then? He announces all that he is going to do in the synagogue at Nazareth. (Luke 4.16-21). Some like it. Some hate it.

By the Fifth Sunday of Lent on March 21st, the decisive conflict is at hand. We hear in John 12.1-8 of Mary anointing Jesus for this work of death and life. And then? Nothing less than Jesus's suffering, Cross and Resurrection, the outpouring of God's love for all, for ever.


On the Sundays in between (Lent 2, 3 and 4), the stories tell some of the variety of Jesus's teaching and works and the variety of human response, expected and unexpected, self-satisfied and faithful. As in each one, we ask "And then?" we find that we are there too, in all that is loving and faithful in us – and all that is very far from that.

And that is not all



All you ever wanted to know about..... the Reverend Donald J. Sampson!

Where were you born?

I was born at Yanston Farm near Kingsbridge, South Devon. My parents were both from farming families of many generations. Thus, although I attended the local grammar school and battled away at learning Latin and Algebra, my mind and heart were set on getting home each day in order to drive our Fordson Tractor. We had purchased it in 1942 for £187! At that stage, I would not have believed anyone who said that I would leave farming at the age of twenty- five to become ordained.

What influenced you to make the change?

My parents had brought up their three sons and a daughter to attend the local Parish Church. Eventually, however, I joined the Young Farmers who attended the Methodist Church where the minister encouraged me to become a Local Preacher. This led to me being accepted to train for ordination at the Methodist Theological College in Bristol. My four years there were most rewarding and I owe a great debt to my tutors and fellow students.

Where have you served as a Minister?

My first five years were spent in Enfield, North London. My last service there was my wedding to Annette, a Primary/ Middle School Teacher. (Since then she has gained a Degree at Birmingham University as Teacher of the Deaf and now does specialist support and teaching at Bournville College. She is part of the Leadership Team at Northfield Methodist Church.)

Our move to Liverpool for seven years proved most enjoyable. Lara and Stephen were both born there. The vigour, friendliness and ecumenical warmth of the people inspired us. Five years in Bristol followed, then eight years in Pinner near Harrow, Middlesex; thereby giving us another taste of London suburban life.

With some experience behind me, I then served as Superintendent of Methodist Circuits in Peterborough for 5 years and Sutton Coldfield for seven years prior to slackening my workload in 'retirement'. I have




Hello Everyone!

Learning from the Life of Jesus

e are in that interesting time of year when, as Church, we live through the landmark moments of lesus' earthly ministry. Moving rapidly from Christmas we get to the baptism of Christ and the revelation of his role as Messiah. Saviour and Lord which leads us into the story of the Passion, Easter Day and Pentecost.

While we have a Christian understanding of salvation based on Jesus' sacrifice - his death - and resurrection, it is his earthly ministry that instructs us how to live as a disciple.

During those three short years between baptism and crucifixion, Jesus shows us what it means to be someone who lives their life at one with God. Through His life we are shown what it means to be part of Church both individually and corporately and looking closely at his way of life we can find our own pattern of living.

We often think the Church was born on Easter Day or Pentecost - that may well be so - but we also recognise that the three years before were just as significant. From Jesus' ministry the church has learnt its concern for healing and for

reconciliation. From Jesus the disciples learnt how to teach, how to preach and how to resolve conflict. lesus also gives us a pretty good idea how Christians are to help others live as disciples through teaching, apprenticeship, mentoring, forthright challenge, prayerfulness and love.

I believe that every Christian in this Diocese needs to continue to learn how to live as a disciple who is in touch with the God who creates and sustains all things. That is why I was so thrilled by the enthusiasm that was tangible at November's conference and emanated from the Feedback forms

It is also the reason for assembling from across the breadth of the Christian movement in England a selection of inspiring speakers, who are themselves disciples, to address us in the Bishop's Lent Lectures which begin on February 24th.

I hope this is just a beginning of our journey together into deeper discipleship, articulate faithfulness and joyful service.



Music for the soul

Church congregations will be aware of the amount of the liturgy that can be sung through well-known settings of the mass and requiem words as well as psalms and other Biblical passages that have been set to music for use as anthems in Christian worship. One of the most poignant texts which has been set to music much less frequently is known as the "Seven last words from the Cross", a compilation from the four gospels of all lesus' sayings at this most terrible time as He approached His death. Composers from the past who have set the words to music include Schütz and Haydn, but in our own day the acclaimed composer James MacMillan has produced a work of tremendous power, commissioned by the BBC in 1993 and first performed on television in Holy Week 1994. There will be a performance of this piece at 7.30pm on 15th May in Symphony Hall, Birmingham by the City of Birmingham Choir alongside the Orchestra of the Swan under the baton of the Choir's director Adrian Lucas. This is a wonderful opportunity for churchgoers to hear the unique thrill of a live performance with a top choir and orchestra bringing a piece of complexity, searing emotion and utmost beauty as it depicts these very telling and painful statements, among them "My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken me?", "It is finished" and the instruction to Mary and the

beloved disciple to each care for the other: "Woman behold thy Son. Behold thy mother".

James MacMillan is a practising Roman Catholic, still leading and composing music for worship in his home church in Scotland. This highly charged piece will be performed with the wellknown setting of the requiem by Gabriel Fauré, a rightly popular piece which, in a very different way, sets Christian faith in a musical context, enabling words such as those of the Sanctus (Holy, holy, holy is the Lord) and "In Paradisum" (May angels lead you into Paradise and may the saints receive you, leading you to the holy city, Jerusalem) to lift the listener through lyrical tunes as on angels' wings to the beauty of that hope of paradise.
