Visiting a grave or ashes Plot

If you are visiting a loved one's grave or plot, please be aware they are subject to national regulations regarding what can be placed on or around a grave or plaque. **These regulations are enforceable by law and prohibited items have to be removed.** Details of the churchyard regulations can be found by clicking <u>this link</u>.

If your grave or plot **does not** look like these they are usually in breach of the regulations.





Commonwealth War Graves: St Nicolas' Churchyard has 18 known Commonwealth War Graves and they are marked with metal poppies.
