At some of our services photographs are taken and the service live-streamed. If you do not wish to be photographed or filmed, please speak to a warden before the service.

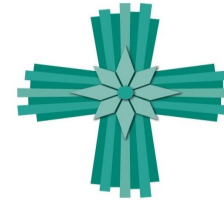

In our Gospel reading this week we hear about the healing of a woman who has suffered from a haemorrhage for 12 years and a little girl, the raising of the daughter of Jairus, one of the leaders of the synagogue. Both stories are about fear and faith, and the power of Jesus to take people from one to the other. The story of the woman gives us hope because as Tom Wright says: “When life crowds in with all its pressures, there is still room for us to creep up behind Jesus – if that’s all we feel we can do – and reach out to touch him, in that odd mixture of fear and faith that characterizes so much Christian discipleship.”
